Voppie's Views

This year in my monthly posts, I'm commenting on my Bible reading as I journey through the Bible with two friends using a YouVersion plan. Having completed the Old Testament readings a couple of weeks ago, we've already read Matthew and are well into Mark.

I decided to reflect the purpose for four eye-witness accounts of the life of Christ. David Mathis gives insight "... consider the concept of God's word. *God speaks*. He reveals himself to us. He communicates with us. His word, as John Frame says is 'his powerful, authoritative self-expression.' Just as the words of a friend are central in revealing his person to us, so it is with God." (*Disciplines of Grace*, p. 38). One of the prime reasons we have four Gospel accounts is that we might encounter Jesus (God incarnate). This is the self-expression of God—so deep, rich, and full that we encounter *a real person*.

JI Packer, in his book *Knowing God*, discusses what knowing God involves: "the more complex the object, the more complex is the knowing of it. Knowledge of something abstract, like a language, is acquired by learning; knowledge of something inanimate [an object]...comes by inspection and exploration...But when one gets to living things, knowing them becomes a good deal more complicated." (p. 37). Packer explains, when it comes to

"knowing" another person, we are dependent on that person revealing himself to us. We can "know" someone by their physical appearance or their mannerisms. But we cannot *really* know them until they reveal their minds to us. And even then, our knowledge of them is dependent on what they choose to reveal to us.

The knowledge of God is infinitely more complex than the knowledge of another person. We can only know God to the extent of what God chooses to reveal about himself to us. God took on human flesh and walked among us. The Bible is where we learn to *know God*. We are incapable of knowing God without God revealing himself to us. As I have been reading the Gospels, the question I've been asking myself is: "who is this Jesus?" But those who wish to boast should boast in this alone: that they truly know me and understand that I am the LORD... Jeremiah 9:24, NLT

Let me give you an example of a glimpse into the character of Jesus (God incarnate): "He looked around at them angrily and was deeply saddened by their hard hearts..." Mark 3:5. I understand from this verse that a hard heart makes God angry and deeply saddens him. Mark 6:6 "And he was amazed at their unbelief" Unbelief amazes God—because God's revelation provides undisputable evidence of who God is, who we are, and what God requires. We are guilty of blasphemy when we refuse to believe.

So, what does all this have to do with the four unique Gospel accounts? As I'm reading the Gospels, I'm encountering a flesh-and-blood person. This person who remained Holy throughout his human life—he never sinned. What's more He gave himself as a sacrifice in my place.

A quote from Packer: "...the almighty creator, the Lord of hosts, the great God before whom the nations are as a drop in a bucket, comes to you and begins to talk to you, through the words and truths of Holy Scripture...you come to realize as you listen that God is actually opening his heart to you, making friends with you, and enlisting you...as a *covenant partner*. It is a staggering thing, but it is true—the relationship in which sinful human beings know who God is." (p. 38-39).

And this is the wonderful journey through the Bible to the heart of God. It's not merely reading, it is receiving the Holy Spirit's interpretation and application to my life, it is learning to know God's nature and character, it is accepting his invitation to believe and obey, and it is rejoicing in the love that initiated a relationship with me and draws me into divine fellowship!

STRAIGHT FROM THE HEART

People often ask why the New Hope Shelter is necessary. It has been here since 2005 for people like "Joan". She lost her place to live when she was kicked out by a roommate. She came into the Shelter with no job in the summer. Less than three months later, she is working 63 hours a week and is the final stages of securing an apartment of her own. We are all about helping people to get a new start. Hundreds have had that opportunity over the years and hundreds more will be assisted as we move forward in building our new facility.

Nationally the statistics show that 70% of the Homeless population are men. That is not the case locally. Our population is routinely 50% women and children and calls for beds come almost every day. We have factored that in to our planning for our new facility.

Many of you have asked for an update on the Building and the Campaign. We have purchased five acres fronting on Meridian Road just south of Casey's in Newton. That parcel has been surveyed, platted, and the new subdivision has been approved by the City of Newton. We are hoping to select a General contractor before the end of the year and start building in early 2023 with completion of the project before the end of 2023.

We need an additional \$800,000 to secure our Foundation challenge grant of \$1,000,000, enabling us to build. Your commitment can come in cash or in a pledge over a period of years. It can be a gift of appreciated stock, farm commodities, real estate or an in-kind gift. The important thing is that every written commitment counts toward our goal, even if it is paid over a period of years. Every dollar counts as we press forward to meet the Challenge. Dear Garden Community Church,

A quick update from the Republic of Georgia, yes, we made it with an uneventful trip if you can call a 14-hour flight uneventful! We did have two days before the Avant leadership retreat started which allowed us to get SIM cards for our phones, get cash at an ATM and rest a little before the retreat started.

There were about 26 of us from the East region, some of us had not seen each other since before the pandemic and of course, there were some new faces! It was a great time of fellowship together and a wonderful speaker who brought us a spiritual feast from Hebrews 12. He must have spent a month preparing these sermons for us, what an encouragement! Our discussion about various leadership issues was also a fruitful time getting us caught up on situations faced by us on the fields.

The last day of the retreat we finally did find an apartment and signed up for it. Just before leaving the hotel in the lobby, Joe missed an unmarked step and went sprawling. He immediately felt he had broken his right wrist, so a teammate took us to a hospital to get x-rayed with the verdict that he would need surgery, so our next night was spent in the hospital before we were able to move into our apartment. The following day the team leader tested positive for covid and now his wife also, so we haven't spent much time with them yet.

The two groups that are working with Ukrainian displaced persons have some big challenges with winter coming on soon. Please pray for wisdom on how best we can help them prepare for this difficult season. One group especially, needs places for the people still in their Ukrainian city to live, as most of their homes have been destroyed.

Well I think it has cooled off her in Wichita, which means blankets, will be in high demand. If you have extra blankets, please consider passing them along to 2nd Blessings.

Isaiah 25:4&5 you have been a refuge for the poor. A refuge for the needy, in his distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat. For the breath of the ruthless is like a storm driving against a wall, and like the heat of the desert. You silence the uproar of foreigners as heat is reduced by the shadow of a cloud, so the song of the ruthless is stilled.

At 8:30 A.M. a faithful volunteer arrived to work. She had tears streaming down her face. We immediately went into the chapel. She began to tell me the heart breaking situation her family is facing. I could not relate to what they were and are facing but as I listened my heart broke.

Their son who has served in the military in Afghanistan came home with severe PTSD as well as an alcoholic. Every July the fireworks really causes his PTSD to manifest in alcohol and anger. When this happens he blacks out and does not remember at all what he has done. This last July he was arrested for what he had done which was very serious charges. He is now facing a very lengthy prison sentence as the counts against him are many. Here is a wonderful Christian family involved in a great local church here in Wichita. This young man's parents are trying to prepare for the days, months, and years ahead. Long story short she was amazed how the Lord brought her to 2nd Blessings as a volunteer, now it has been made very clear to her. She could not believe how I came along beside and was there for her and her family to listen and pray. Such a sweet Christian man who really messed up and is now paying the price. This type if ministry has increased over the past year as we visit and pray with people whose churches, families, and friends disintegrate before their eyes and no one is there for them. 2nd Blessings is there for each and every one seeking comfort and prayer. Thank you Lord for the opportunity given to me as Chaplain at 2nd Blessings.
