"She is Mine is a touching and moving memoir detailing Stephanie Fast's inspiring journey of rejection, abandonment, pain, abuse, survival and finally redemption. Stephanie was born the child of a Korean woman and an American Serviceman during the Korean War. Stephanie's mixed heritage is frowned upon in a nation trying to recover from the Korean War and is abandoned by her family at the tender age of four. Nameless, homeless ad seemingly without hope, Stephanie travels the South Korean countryside struggling to survive for three years until she is recused and put in an orphanage where she is finally adopted by a American couple. The Poetic Wonders of Isaac Watts by Douglas Bond "Isaac Watts was an extraordinarily gifted poet, one who virtually thought in rhyme and meter, and who wrote most of his poetry in first draft." He is known as the Father of English Hymnody and wrote 750 hymns, many that are still sung by the Church today, including, "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross", "Joy to the World" and "I Sing the Mighty Power of God." Encouraged by his parents to exercise his ability to make up rhymes, they eventually grew tired of it. As his father prepared to punish young Isaac for disobeying their directive, he replied, "O father, do some mercy take, And I will no more verses make." He just could not forsake his gift.

I commend to you this biography, much needed in our day and age, when so much of our music is doctrinally feeble and congregationally unsingable. Watts suffered from ill health all his life, but his deep love of his Savior and desire to see Him lifted up channeled into the poetry that has blessed the church for centuries. As a pastor and theologian, he was well-equipped to use his God-given talent for creating beautiful rhymes expressing the glories of God. **LuAnn McMannis**

My journey with two friends through the Bible finds us in Psalms. What blessing to read scripture together! Why not grab a friend and start a reading plan together! You Version allows you to read with a friend and comment after each day's reading. It's a wonderful way to support consistency and growth!

Psalm 78 is a history lesson for the post-exilic Israelites. Asaph sits down to recount God's faithfulness against the blackness of the people's unfaithfulness. In the first verses Asaph says, "I'm about to tell you something REALLY important...listen up!" History is never just a recounting of what happened; history is an analyzation of what happened, why it happened, and drawing lessons from those events.

Then Asaph lays out the sin problem Israel had, which he will be illustrating with this history lesson:

- 1. Stubbornness
- 2. Rebelliousness
- 3. Unfaithfulness

Asaph points out how these characteristics caused the people to test God and how God reacted with judgement and in goodness.

First, (verses 9-33) the people were unfaithful to God in the wilderness. They complained about lack of food, they refused to trust God to provide for them (even though he just rescued them in a miraculous way), they doubted the presence and lovingkindness of God. In short, they questioned God's promises and didn't trust God to do what he said he would do.

Second, (verses 34-55) God responds to their doubt and lack of trust in Him. God's wrath was on full display as he sent death and hardship. But his mercy was also on full display (verse 38). God was not faithless—he was faithful to all his promises—dating back to the Abrahamic Covenant in Genesis 12.

Third, (verses 56-64) the Psalmist focuses on the people's disobedience. Lack of faith and trust always leads to disobedience (verse 56). It is of utmost importance that we

trust (believe) God no matter how things look on the horizontal level. God is honored when we have faith (Hebrews 11).

The final verses of Psalm 78 circle back around to Asaph's opening statements: what happens when people fail so miserably that all seems lost? The answer, of course, is found in God!! God was working out a magnificent plan that would not only rescue stubborn Israel but would bring the definitive answer to sin and death: Jesus—the Messiah! As the second Adam, Jesus does not fail. Jesus is the perfect King (unlike the unfaithful human kings of Israel and Judah). Jesus is the true temple (and can never be destroyed!)

Back to the beginning of Psalm 78. Asaph lays out three virtues that are the opposite of the three sins (verse 7):

- 1. Instead of stubbornness, Israel should hope anew in God!
- 2. Instead of rebelliousness, Israel should remember His provision (recalling how God fully met their needs in the past and trusting Him with their present and future).
- 3. Instead of unfaithfulness, Israel should obey God's commands—willingly, fully, joyfully.

These three virtues lead to abundant life (Deuteronomy 28:1-14).

Why is it so easy to read all this—laid out in Psalm 78—and yet so hard to see my own stubbornness, rebelliousness, and unfaithfulness?! I pray that the Lord will continue to tenderize my heart, increasing my faithfulness to God's Word—loving it, meditating on it, tucking it in my heart, and living my life according to it. Because this is challenging to do, we need each other. Our church family and fellow believers are a wonderful resource to us!

My people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth with a parable; I will utter hidden things, things from of oldthings we have heard and known, things our ancestors have told us. We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done.

Greetings from SonSet Solutions. The picture is Tim receiving some training. We are looking at the shortwave transmitter that we produce here in Elkhart. I am so grateful for the training I receive from very smart engineers at SonSet Solutions. I always take a notebook when I go to the Electronics Lab.

When FM will not cover enough area, we install shortwave. It will reach 300 miles which is enough to cover many countries. It works well near the equator and it does not require electricity or internet.

Of course, the SonSet® radios make this work even better. They are capable of receiving shortwave. They have a high performance receiver in them that works with the lanyard antenna.

No electricity is needed for the transmitter if a solar system is installed or a generator is run. The SonSet® radios have a solar panel on the back for charging the battery without the need for electricity.

No internet is needed because the shortwaves bounce off an atmospheric layer 200 miles above and return to the earth. The equatorial regions are the best because of the bulge in this layer. This produces a focusing effect that allows the use of a 1000 watt transmitter. This has low enough power consumption for a small ministry.

Dear Garden Community Church,

Thank you so much for your prayers for the safe delivery of the printing press. God is faithful, we have great news, the press arrived in Oleksandriya and was unloaded today! It is now safely inside the building which is a huge praise!

When the truck first got to the border the line of trucks was just over 30 miles long with an estimated time of crossing the border last Sunday. The line turned out to be much longer or slower than we were first told as it only crossed the border on Thursday. Friday it cleared customs in western Ukraine, then traveled about 500 miles to Oleksandriya with delivery and unloading today.

Sometimes our prayers are not answered exactly like we would have wanted them to be answered as July 1 the tax exemption was repealed. Therefore, we had to pay the 24% customs tariffs, we don't know the final amounts including delivery and installation but we do know that God is in control and provides what we need. Now we rejoice that the press arrived safely!
