Vonnie's Views

After a challenging end to 2025, I felt a renewed need to anchor myself more deeply in Truth. As I looked ahead to 2026, my original plan was to step away from a full Bible read-through and instead focus on studying individual books of Scripture. But as the year approached, I realized I simply couldn't let go of reading through the entire Bible once again. This time, I'm using a unique plan that traces themes and people throughout Scripture—guiding me through every chapter of the Bible while helping me see how God's story unfolds as a whole.

Alongside this, I'm also studying the attributes of God, with particular focus on several of His incommunicable attributes, those qualities that belong to God alone. These include His independence, unchangeableness, eternity, omnipresence, and unity. While God does not share these attributes with us in the same way, we can still see faint reflections of them in human life, even as much remains a mystery.

Scripture reminds us of this tension between what we are able to know and what we cannot fully grasp. As Solomon wrote, "He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also, he has put eternity into man's heart, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end" (Ecclesiastes 3:11).

When I find myself wrestling with perplexing circumstances, Scripture is where I need to turn—not because Scripture will explain my life there, but because God reveals Himself there. The God who created the world, called Abraham, brought Babylon into the gates of Jerusalem, was born in Bethlehem, died on Calvary, and rose again is the same God who oversees our lives today. He is present in the joyful moments, the sorrowful ones, and in the things we do not understand.

Through this year's Bible reading and study of God's attributes, I'm not expecting "answers," such as understanding the "whys" of all that we have experienced. What I am expecting is to be freshly amazed by God Himself—the One I desire to seek, to know, and to love.

As I've been studying these attributes, the hymn "*Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise*" has taken on new meaning for me. Its lyrics give voice to truths Scripture affirms but our minds can never fully comprehend. Rather than explaining God, the hymn invites us to worship Him; to stand in awe of the One who is eternal, unchanging, present everywhere, directly and deeply involved in our lives.

Immortal, invisible, God only wise,
In light inaccessible hid from our eyes,
Most blessed, most glorious, O Ancient of Days,
Almighty, victorious, Thy great name we praise.

Unresting, unchanging, and silent as light,
Nor wanting, nor wasting, Thou rulest in might;
Thy justice like mountains high soaring above
Thy clouds which are fountains of goodness and love.

To all, life Thou givest, to both great and small;
In all life Thou livest, the true life of all;
We blossom and flourish as leaves on the tree,
And wither and perish, but naught changeth Thee.

Great Father of glory, pure Father of light,
Thine angels adore Thee, all veiling their sight;



Peru 2025



My (Renee) trip to Peru in May was wonderful! Thank you for praying. God took care of every detail. I traveled to Peru with two others from SonSet Solutions. We joined partner missionaries, Brad and Gina Shaw, in Cotahuasi, Peru. The Shaws have served in Peru since 2001. Tim, with others from HCJB, helped get their FM radio station on the air in 2008. Then in 2023 SonSet Solutions helped them put a shortwave station on the air. These signals reach the villages in the Cotahuasi Canyon and surrounding mountains. Brad's goal for our visit was to travel to villages high in the Andes mountains and deliver SonSet Radios so the people could receive the shortwave signal.

In each village, we connected with a believer or a pastor who could distribute radios to those they were ministering to. And everywhere we went we heard things like, "We didn't know you were coming but God gave us the opportunity to come together" and "I believe God sent you here." We were able to encourage the believers and leave radios with them so they can hear Biblical teaching every day. They are hungry for good Bible teaching.
