Voppie's Views

Recently, Gerhard and I visited a Vitreo-Retinal specialist to check out some concerning symptoms he was experiencing. Thankfully, what could have indicated a retinal detachment turned out to be an age-related condition that only requires monitoring. The retina was intact. Still, the experience gave me much to reflect on—especially in a spiritual sense.

We see *out* of our eyes, not *into* them. Eyes are amazing organs, helping us perceive beauty, depth, and color. But when those flashing lights and large floaters appeared, although Gerhard could see them, we couldn't examine the eye ourselves to understand what was going on. A glance in the mirror showed a normal external eye, but beneath the surface, something serious could have been developing.

So we sought help—first from our eye doctor, then from a specialist with the tools and the expertise to investigate more deeply. To examine the retina, his pupils were dilated. Scans were taken. The doctor used magnification and light to look closely at what we couldn't see on our own. Only then could a true diagnosis be made.

This reminds me of the heart—not the organ that pumps blood, but the core of who we are: the seat of our beliefs, choices, and motivations. Like our eyes, we can't really look *into* our hearts. We may observe our own actions or those of others, but understanding the deeper reasons behind them is often beyond us.

Even our self-evaluations are limited. We might wonder, *Why did I react that way? Why do I keep making that choice?* The real answers lie deep within. Just as we needed a specialist to examine the retina, we need a spiritual Specialist to examine our hearts.

Scripture speaks directly to this. Jeremiah 17:9–10 tells us:

"The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it? 'I the Lord search the heart and test the mind, to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his deeds.'"

The Holy Spirit doesn't just diagnose—He heals.

"Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. (Joel 2:12–13)

Just as regular eye exams are vital, so are regular heart check-ups. Proverbs 4:23 urges us: *"Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life."*

The Spirit's treatment is always restorative:

"And I will give them one heart, and a new spirit I will put within them... that they may walk in my statutes... and they shall be my people, and I will be their God." (Ezekiel 11:19–20)

> Is it time for you to open your heart to an exam by the Holy Spirit? He's ready—and His Word is a great place to begin.

In our last newsletter, we mentioned repairing and painting our two towers the main broadcasting tower on Cedar Mountain and the one in town we use with our backup transmitter.


Let us introduce you to yet another tower—one that we are in the process of buying! More importantly, we are buying the license for a radio station which accompanies this tower!

This new radio station is located in rural Ibiapina, about 75 miles from Harvest Radio, and in a strategic location to expand our broadcast area into a totally different audience. We plan to re-transmit Harvest Radio's 24 hour Christian programming, initially at low power (phase 1). Even so, we will be planting seeds of the Gospel to assist Avant and national missionaries already working in that area.

Praise the Lord, He has provided, through the generous gifts of His people, enough money to purchase the license (complete with tower and antenna). We have already begun purchasing other equipment and as soon as we get the paperwork signed, we'll start working on getting it on the air.

As God provides funds, we plan to upgrade the license to a higher power (phase 2), which will further increase our listening audience—we estimate it will more than double our current audience.
