Vonnie's Views

If you know me well, you know I love to read. I love buying books, holding them in my hands with a pencil in my right hand, ready to mark them up and "make them mine." That's probably why our bookshelves at home are overflowing! At any given time, I'm reading at least three books.

I recently finished a book that deeply impacted me: Waiting Isn't a Waste: The Surprising Comfort of Trusting God in the Uncertainties of Life by Mark Vroegop. I highly recommend it to you—because we all end up waiting at some point in our lives!

I don't like to wait, and I suspect I'm not alone in that. Vroegop's book is a practical and pastoral guide on how not to waste our seasons of waiting. His main point is simple but profound: waiting is part of life, whether we like it or not. So, if we're all going to wait, how can we do it well? And how is *Biblical* waiting different from ordinary waiting?

Vroegop defines waiting as "the gap" between something longed for and that longing being fulfilled. That gap might be as minor as a travel delay or as major as waiting years for a prodigal child to return, a marriage to heal, or a dream to be realized. Waiting can become a valuable opportunity for growth, but only if we choose

to engage the gap intentionally.

He argues that we need to develop a theology of waiting but warns that it's hard to build that theology in the middle of a painful delay. Instead, we're wise to think through how to wait well before we find ourselves in the gap.

The chapter headings themselves provide a helpful roadmap. We wait:

- **Honestly** (waiting is hard)
- Frequently (waiting is common)
- Thoughtfully (waiting is Biblical)
- Patiently (waiting is slow)
- Intentionally (waiting is commanded)
- Collectively (waiting is relational)

This book has been deeply affirming. It helped me realize that while waiting is difficult, it's not unusual. I shouldn't be surprised when I find myself in a waiting season. One of the ways

I waste my waiting is not acknowledging how hard it is and why it is hard. God is in control of the events of my life and the timing of those events. Therefore, I can rest in His providence.

In fact, my view of God becomes *clearer* in the waiting. I might find I have misconceptions about God that the waiting season exposes. Waiting while focusing on God and worshipping God is a radical act of faith. Vroegop offers this definition of waiting: "Waiting requires living by what I know to be true about God when I don't know what's true about my life." (p. 39) That definition is worth reflecting on.

Waiting pushes me toward prayer. It reminds me that I'm not in control, but God is. And it's in those powerless moments that I can experience His power and His comfort in fresh ways. Scripture repeatedly commands believers to "wait on the Lord." One that stood out was Jesus' instruction to the disciples in Acts 1:4-5 to wait for the promised Holy Spirit. Jesus didn't tell them how long they should wait—just that they should wait in Jerusalem and wait together. Waiting together draws believers into corporate prayer and mutual encouragement.

One of the most helpful takeaways for me was Vroegop's challenge to rethink waiting not as something passive or idle, but as something profoundly active. Biblical waiting is intensive soul work. If I allow it, my time in the gap can refine me like gold— establishing me more closely in my relationship with God, reshaping my character, deepening my faith, and strengthening my confidence in the absolute goodness of God.

Biblical waiting is active and intentional. It is connected to faith, hope, and trust in God when life is filled with the tension of uncertainty. Rather than chafing in the gap of waiting. I'm beginning to see it as an invitation to draw even nearer to my loving Heavenly Father.

It was communities like this one that we were looking for. Brad and Gina Shaw, SIM missionaries to Peru since 2001, have a burden to reach the Quechua speaking people of the high Andes mountains. In 2023 they added shortwave broadcasting to their radio work. The signal now reaches these areas but the people do not have shortwave receivers. And they don't know about Radio Senda Cristiana.

Renee and two co-workers from SonSet Solutions traveled to Peru to visit these communities and to help hand out the SonSet® radio receivers. Brad had been given a list of churches and believers to try to connect with. No one knew we were coming. God lead us to the right people in each community.

Everywhere we went we met believers hungry for fellowship and more of God's Word. We were able to encourage pastors and other believers and to leave them with a radio. Now they can hear the teaching of the Word from Radio Senda Cristiana every day. Pray for spiritual growth in the believers there.

There are many more communities like this scattered throughout the mountains. Travel to and from these communities is a challenge. Radio can reach the most remote. Praise God for radio ministries who faithfully teach the Bible and reach "the least of these."

RADIO STATION PURCHASE

Thank you so much for praying

for the purchase of FM 104.7 in Ibiapina in the northern part of the state in which we live! On July 25, after 6 months of negotiations and alot of prayer, the sales contract was signed! Our lawyers have submitted all the necessary paperwork

with the government and we are free to go on the air.



Phase 1 is to get FM 104.7, Ibiapina, on the

air as soon as possible at the low power at which it is registered. The purchase included a tower and antenna, but the rest of the equipment needs to be purchased and installed, including the audio link to re-broadcast the programming from Harvest Radio FM 102.7 in Nova Russas.

We chose September 1 to be our target date to go live. This is Harvest Radio's 21st anniversary, and it seemed like a great way to celebrate God's faithfulness!

PARTNERSHIP

The new radio station, FM 104.7

in Ibiapina will reach into numerous towns where Avant-related Churches are being started or planned. At a recent

planning meeting of lay workers and missionaries who are involved in these church planting



efforts, it was decided that at least 4 of these towns will be canvased with pamphlets advertising the new station.

What a privilege to partner with them through our Bible-based programming.

FULL SPEED AHEAD

By faith, we had already ordered some

of the equipment before signing the contract. The transmit-

ter has already arrived, as have parts for several computers.

We requested power to the site and had the power pole and meter box installed. PTL the electric company has





already hooked things up and internet is scheduled to get installed next week.

The last week of August, our friend and IT specialist Jesse Regier from Omaha, and our son, Nathan will be arriving to help with the final installation of all the equipment and getting it on the air.

PLEASE PRAY

- The next 3 weeks will be crazy busy getting things installed and running correctly to go on the air Sept. 1. Pray for stamina, health and safety.
- Pray that all the equipment arrives in a timely manner.
- Pray for Nathan and Jesse's time here.
- Pray for complete funding (we're lacking about \$15,000)
- Pray the Lord will be preparing the hearts of the future listeners to receive His word.
- Pray also for the spiritual well-being of our staff as we are on the frontlines in a spiritual battle. We have 11 full and part-time staff and will be looking for another salesperson to increase our advertising base within the new listening area.
